Teaching & Learning	
Purchase a wide range of age appropriate specialised equipment to assist in the delivery of the PE curriculum.	Specialist equipment improved the quality of the teaching & learning of PE across the school, ensuring pupils could access accurate equipment to support with learning the skills for a range of sports.
Providing cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and Sport. Employing specialist qualified coaches to help increase teachers' subject knowledge and confidence in PE.	Ongoing CPD for staff with a PE focus improved the quality of T&L for pupils across the school with staff having an improved subject knowledge and a wider bank of strategies to improve their teaching.
Implementation and development of P.E curriculum across the Academy. Implementation of the PE Hub for a whole school approach towards P.E lessons.	Implementing PE Hub to support with the PE Curriculum across the school ensured a high quality, progressive curriculum is in place for all pupils across the school.
Following the Primary Leadership Programme to develop our children to become Sports Ambassadors.	Supported pupils personal development and leadership skills, giving them wider curriculum opportunities and responsibilities within the school.

Buying into existing local sports networks such as School Sport Partnerships, Schools Youth Trust and Community Sports Coaching Initiatives. Implementing and embedding strong, sustainable partnerships with local community sports clubs.	These ensure that our pupils have the opportunity to attend a wide range of events outside of school by building relationships with local schools.
Enrichment Lead role used to manage and facilitate the ongoing implementation of the PE Strategy, extra-curricular clubs and staff CPD.	This member of staff was able to facilitate a range of sporting events, Sports Days and wider curricular opportunities linked to the PE Strategy.
Use of the house system to engage children in regular, inter-house sports competitions.	House system referred to weekly in assemblies with points given as part of the behaviour policy across the school.
Enrichment Activities	
Paying external sports coaches to run competitions, or to increase pupils' participation in national school games competitions.	Developing pupil experience in a range of competitions and giving them wider curricular opportunities to develop their Cultural Capital.
Providing places for pupils in a wide range of after-school sport clubs and paying staff to run extra-curricular clubs that are on offer to all pupils and further opportunities to engage in team sports including: netball, basketball, tennis, hockey, gymnastics, boys' football and girls' football.	Pupils received places in range of clubs, giving them the chance to develop their sports skills across a wide range of sporting activities. This increased their physical and mental wellbeing and provided wider curricular opportunities.
Every pupil participates in the Annual Sports Day, with all pupils competing in competitive races and receiving a medal.	All pupils took part in Sports Day, with parents able to come and watch. Pupils took part in a range of competitive and non-competitive activities, developing their sporting and personal skills.
Swimming lessons for KS2 year groups throughout a school academic term, delivered by qualified instructors at Pelham's Leisure Centre.	Pupils in Years3 & 4 went swimming at Pelham's Leisure centre and received high quality swimming lessons by qualified instructors. Y4 – 26/36, 72% & Y3 – 41/56, 73% of pupils achieved the end of KS2 expectations of swimming 25m.
