English:

Test week: Children will be completing reading, SPaG and spelling tests to aid teacher's understanding. In the second week, children will be performing their stories to an audience.



Maths:

Children will be learning how to find fractions of amounts, multiplying and dividing fractions and being able to put fractions in their simplest form.




Reading:

During our reading lessons, we will be focusing on all of the comprehension skills as well as developing their fluency. Our current Whole Class Reading Book is Goodnight Mr Tom and our lessons link to this and WW2.

Science:

We will be continuing our 'Light' topic. We will be learning the different parts of the eye and children will need to label it independently.



Foundation Lessons:

Geography: Linking to our WW2 topic, we will be looking at different land uses from our school trip and learning about renewable and non renewable gases.

Personal, Social, Health Education: We will be learning about keeping safe on the internet, what information should be shared and what should not be shared online, including having strong, safe passwords.

Music: We begin preparations for our Carol Service and creating our own rap.



Home Learning

Monday – My Maths work set

Wednesday – Reading Plus

Daily - Reading x 3 times weekly (minimum).

4x or more weekly reads = Reading Champion and 5 minutes extra play on a Friday lunchtime!

How You Can Help At Home:

Reading Matters! Please read with your child daily and ensure that this is recorded in their planner. Ask them questions about what they are reading to support with comprehension. Remember, parent signatures are required in the planners to evidence their reading and become a reading champion.

Support your child with Mental Maths:

- Times tables are really important, keep testing your children at home.
- Simple fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents e.g. $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{5}$ and finding these fractions of amounts.

Reminders:

Please ensure your child's jumper and water bottle are labelled to help reduce the amount which are going missing. Please ensure correct school uniform is worn at all times.
