Fortnight Commencing: 15th January 2024




English:

Using our new book, Pig Heart Boy by Malorie Blackman, we will be writing an effective story based on similar themes that the book covers. In the second week, we will be understanding, planning and writing explanation texts.

Maths:


We will be deepening our understanding of Ratio and Proportion to the children. They will be learning equivalent ratios and finding quantities in relative proportions.



Reading:

We will be delving further into our new Whole Class Reading Book, Pig Heart Boy by reading a few more chapters and learning more about our main character; Cam. We will also be looking at a biography of Alexander Fleming linked to our Science and History topic.

Science:



For our blood-heart topic, children will be exploring the structure and function of the human heart and using iPads to aid their understanding.

Foundation Lessons:

History: Throughout the next two weeks in History, the children will be looking at key historical figures that have impacted medicine and researching the NHS in order to present their ideas.

Spanish: In Spanish, we will be learning about our weekend routines and how these differ from each other
